PIN IT. BIN IT.

Deflate balloons after use, remove ribbons and dispose of every part responsibly.



DON'T LET GO.

Never release balloons outdoors. Keep every helium balloon securely weighted.



DON'T INHALE.

Helium displaces oxygen.

- Never inhale helium from a balloon or cylinder.
- Never let a balloon cover a child's face or head.
- Keep cylinders and deflating balloons away from children.

WHY THIS MATTERS

- Helium is non-toxic, but inhaling it displaces oxygen and can cause unconsciousness without warning.
- Foil balloons conduct electricity. Released balloons can cause power cuts, fires and danger on railways.
- Any released balloon becomes litter and may harm wildlife. Deflating balloons can pose a suffocation risk.
